Legislative

HB 264 PN 361 would amend the Municipality Authorities Act to require authorities to establish minimum fiscal procedures related to designated depositories of money, procedures to bill and collect payments, and require the approval of the annual audit and financial report of the authority by a vote at a public meeting. The bill would also allow the filing of the annual report with DCED within 180 days of its fiscal year, for an authority with a fiscal year other than a calendar year, and to provide that report to the municipality creating the authority or any other municipality with residents served by the authority.

HB 406 PN 1145 would require a public meeting pursuant to public notice prior to entering into an agreement to sell or lease a water or sewer system.

HB 751 PN 801 would amend the Public Utility Code to eliminate the power of the PUC to order municipal authorities to acquire troubled water or sewer systems. PMMA has opposed this in order to retain the option of acquisition of such systems by municipal authorities.

HB 860 PN 1127 would amend the Right to Know Law to clarify the personal financial and other information of employees of political subdivisions including authorities that is exempt from disclosure, and to clarify that an agency's financial institutions account and other numbers are exempt from disclosure.

HB 882 PN 993, HB 883 PN 994, HB 884, PN 995, HB 885 PN 1050 reintroduces a series of legislation from the last two sessions to address perceived financial excesses involving the financial troubles of the City of Harrisburg and its municipal authority. The legislation would require additional oversight of debt financings where a municipality is guaranteeing the issuance of debt of a municipal authority, including prior proceedings under the Debt Act, disclosure of certain financial information, limiting the use of proceeds and the use of swaps in financings and the requirement for a performance bond, letter of credit, or a restrictive or escrow account as financial security for a project, and not any other type of financial security.

HB 1069 PN 1230 would amend the Sunshine Act to require the posting of agendas at least 24 hours in advance of a meeting and prohibit the agency from taking action on matters not on the posted agenda at that meeting, subject to certain exceptions for emergency or *de minimus* business.
